ACCUPLACER placement assessments determine a test taker's readiness to participate successfully in college-level coursework. Untimed and available in reading, writing, and math, these assessments are designed for use at postsecondary institutions.

Next-Generation Assessments

Next-generation ACCUPLACER placement tests are designed to more effectively help institutions place students in classes that match their skill level, and include texts and tasks encountered in first-year college courses. Next-generation tests:

- Align to the same content domain continuum as the SAT* Suite of Assessments.

The **Next-Generation Reading** test assesses a test taker's ability to derive meaning from a range of texts and to determine the meaning of words in short and extended contexts. Passages on the test cover a range of content areas, writing modes, and complexities. Four broad knowledge and skill categories are assessed:

- Information and ideas
- Rhetoric
- Synthesis
- Vocabulary

The **Next-Generation Writing** test assesses a test taker's ability to revise and edit multiparagraph text. Questions cover two broad knowledge and skills categories, each containing three subcategories:


- Expression of ideas (development, organization, and effective language use)
- Standard English conventions (sentence structure, conventions of punctuation, and conventions of usage)

The **Next-Generation Arithmetic** test focuses on the following knowledge and skills categories:

- Whole number operations

- Number comparisons and equivalents

The **Next-Generation Quantitative Reasoning, Algebra, and Statistics** test is for students who are entering non-STEM fields of study or who are undecided on a major. Questions focus on the following knowledge and skills categories:

ACCUPLACER for English Language Learners

ACCUPLACER ESL gives educators the tools needed for assessing English language learners. Students are tested across a wide range of abilities, including writing, and scores are provided immediately.

The **ESL Reading Skills** test assesses a test taker's comprehension of short passages. The test contains brief passages of 50 words or less and moderate-length passages of 50 to 90 words. There are two content areas:

- Literal comprehension
- Inference

The **ESL Sentence Meaning** test measures how well a test taker understands the meaning of sentences in English. It assesses the understanding of word meanings in one or two sentence contexts. Four content areas are assessed:

- Particles, phrasal verbs, and prepositions
- Adverbs, adjectives, and connectives sequences
- Basic nouns and verbs
- Basic and important idioms

The **ESL Language Use** test measures a test taker's proficiency in using correct grammar in English sentences. Five content areas are assessed:

- Nouns, pronouns, and pronoun case structure
- Sentence structure
- Subject-verb agreement
- Adverbs, adjectives, and verbs
- Subordination and coordination

The **ESL Listening** test measures the ability of nonnative speakers of English to listen to and understand one or more people speaking in English. Two content areas are assessed, each containing multiple subcategories:

 - Understand the relationship between ideas
 - Make inferences

WritePlacer

In addition to the multiple-choice tests, ACCUPLACER offers WritePlacer® for native speakers of English and WritePlacer ESL for nonnative speakers. Both scores can be used in conjunction with other ACCUPLACER test scores to assist with the placement of students into college-level, developmental, and English as a Second Language courses.

Responses are scored online immediately by the WritePlacer holistic scoring system, a platform that utilizes artificial intelligence to score writing samples and open-ended responses. Instant scoring allows you to incorporate results into branching profiles and placement rules.
